APPENDIX No. 01

to Permit No. PR-6424

(Refuse)

- (a) The discharge of refuse to which this appendix is applicable is from McBride and surrounding area as shown on the attached Appendix A-1.
- (b) The rate at which refuse may be discharged is a maximum of 28 cubic meters per day.
- (c) The type of the refuse which may be discharged is municipal.
- (d) The components of the refuse which may be discharged are that of typical municipal refuse.
- (e) The works authorized are a landfill operation with regulated open burning as directed approximately located as shown on the attached Appendix A-1.
- (f) The land to which the refuse is to be discharged and to which this appendix is appurtenant is a site located on Crown Land, commencing at a point on the H.W.M. of Legrand Creek said point being 402m east of the NW corner of L.7077 C.L.D.; thence 1509m S 50° E; thence 482m N 38° E; thence 1750m N 50° W to the easterly H.W.M. of Legrand Creek; thence in a general southwesterly direction along the easterly H.W.M. of Legrand Creek to the aforesaid point of commencement.
- (g) The works authorized must be complete and in operation on and from the date of this Appendix.

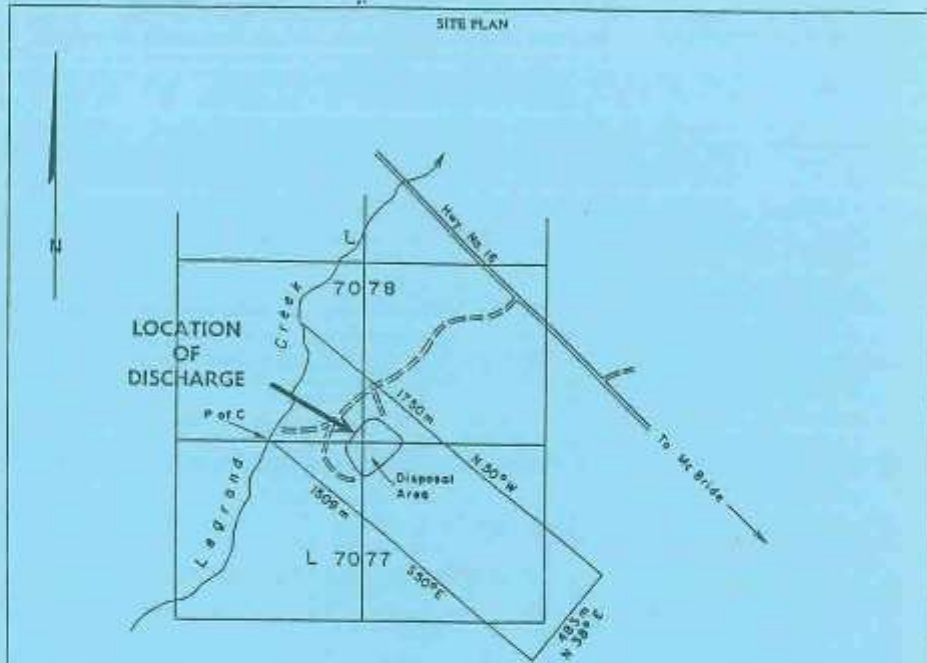

APPENDIX No. B-1

to Permit No. FR-6424

A. LANDFILL OPERATION

The Permittee shall maintain the landfill authorized in Appendix 01 as a modified Level "D" operation in accordance with the Pollution Control Objectives for Municipal Type Waste Discharges in British Columbia, dated 1975. The landing at the refuse site shall be cleared off and the refuse deposited into the trench once per week. The refuse shall be compacted in the trench and soil cover is to be applied once per 20 days of operation and at least once per month. The Regional Waste Manager may vary the frequency of covering when freezing conditions adversely affect normal operation.

B. WILDLIFE NUISANCE

The subject discharge is one that is of concern because of the possibility of a nuisance or hazard being caused by bears or other animals attracted to the site. Additional works may be required or other operating instructions may be issued by the Regional Waste Manager if such problems arise.

C. SITE PREPARATION AND RESTORATION

Provision of fencing, site access, vehicle safety barriers, surface water diversionary works, firebreaks and site restoration as required, shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the Regional Waste Manager.

D. SEGREGATION OF METALLIC WASTES

Segregate large metallic wastes such as appliances and auto bodies, etc., for disposal in a separate area of the site.

E. OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR REGULATED BURNING

- a) Burning can only take place when it is approved by the Ministry of Forests and Lands who determine whether it is safe to burn from a fire safety point of view and will also specify the conditions under which burning can take place and the fire control measures required.
- b) Burning shall take place only when an attendant is on duty, unless this requirement is waived by the Regional Waste Manager, and when conditions promote rapid combustion and dispersion of combustion products.
- c) Generally, no waste shall be burned which is unacceptable to the Regional Waste Manager. Unacceptable materials include large quantities of rubber, plastics, tars, insulation, etc.
- d) Animal carcasses and parts thereof are not to be burned and should be buried separately.
